Timothy

- 2 Timothy was one of the last of Paul's letters. 2 Tim. 4:6,7 hints at this. Probably written between AD 65 & 67.
- 1 & 2 Timothy were letters written to Timothy by Paul. Paul wrote these letters to encourage Timothy to be a good preacher.
 - o 1 Tim 4:11 Command and teach
 - 1 Tim 4:13 Give attendance to reading
 - o 2 Tim 2:15 Study the Word of God
 - o 2 Tim 4:2 Preach the Word
 - o 2 Tim 4:5 Do the work of an evangelist
- Timothy was a young man when Paul wrote to him.
 - 1 Tim 4:12 (Possibly AD 64) Let no man despise thy youth.
 - 2 Tim 2:22 Flee youthful lusts
- Timothy is described in 1 Corinthians (written up to 10 years earlier AD 56)
 - 1 Cor 4:17 beloved son, faithful in the Lord
 - 1 Cor 16:10,11 he worketh the work of the Lord. Timothy was a young man doing God's work.
- The Bible mentions a few things about his childhood which we will focus on today.
- Acts 16:1 is the first time Timothy is mentioned. He was from Lystra and had a Jewish mother and a Greek father.
- 2 Tim 1:5 His unfeigned (sincere) faith dwelt first in his grandmother Lois, and his mother Eunice.
- 2 Tim 3:15 From a child he had known the holy scriptures. These were able to make him wise unto salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.
- 1 Tim 1:2 Paul often calls him 'his son' and in this verse, 'his son in the faith'. So Paul was probably the one who showed him the way of salvation but knowing the Scriptures early helped Timothy's understanding.
- Get to know God's Word.
