God's Word

- God is the author but used about forty men to write His word. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost. (2Pe 1:21)
- All scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: (2Ti 3:16)
- God's word teaches us, tells us where we go wrong, tells us what is right and shows us how to live right.
- It is a living book. It is God talking to us.
